Eight (8) of the 48 credits must be upper division (300-level or higher) to fulfill the university's Liberal Studies requirement. Each course title is followed by a number in parenthesis (4). This number indicates the number of credits for that course. Course titles followed by more than one number, such as (2-4), indicate a variable-credit course.

Superscript Number:

- Superscript number (10) indicates that a course meets more than one goal area requirement. For example, NSCI 20410 listed under Goal 3 meets Goals 3 and 10. Although the credits count only once, the course satisfies the two goal area requirements.
- Separated by a comma (3,LS) indicates that a course will meet both areas indicated.
- Separated by a forward slash (7/8) indicates that a course will meet one or the other goal area but not both.

• Indicates that a course will meet the Liberal Studies requirement.
